GENERAL RADIOGRAPHY (X-RAYS)

Radiography is a medical imaging technique which uses X-rays to obtain radiological images of specific body parts.

This procedure, which lasts approximately between 5 to 15 minutes, helps detect wounds, fractures, infections, degenerative diseases and other pathologies.

<u>Preparation</u>

This procedure does not require any preparation or appointment. For abdominal and/or pelvic X-rays, it is preferable that you urinate before.

Medical contraindication

Pregnancy is a contraindication of this procedure.

The radiography procedure (step by step)

- One of our assistants will take care of you and accompany you to the changing rooms.
- Depending on which body part is targeted, the technician will ask you to position yourself in different ways (i.e. lying down or standing) in order to obtain the radiological images.
- You may leave the premises once the procedure is over.

The immediate effects of the procedure

Radiography is a procedure without any felt effects.

After the procedure

Your results will be sent to your attending physician, who will follow up if necessary.
